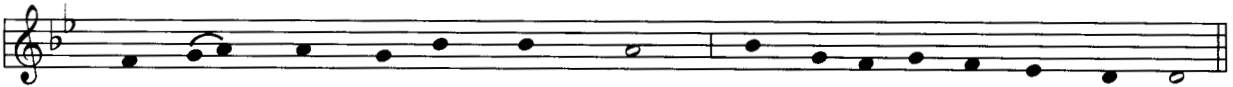

- 3 How long shall the wícked, Ó LORD, *
how long shall the wick/ed tríumþh?
- 4 They bluster ín their ínsölence; *
all evildoers are full / of bóasting.

- 5 They crush your péople, 'Ö LORD, *
and afflict your cho/sen nátiön.
- 6 They murder the wídow and the stránger *
and put the or/phans tó dëath.
- 7 Yet they say, "The LÓRD does nót see, *
the God of Jacob takes / no nótiçe."
- 8 Consider well, you dullards amóng the pëople; *
when will you fools / underständ?
- 9 He that planted the ear, dóes he nót hear? *
he that formed the eye, / does hé not sée?
- 10 He who admonishes the nations, will hé not pünish? *
he who teaches all the world, has he / no knówlëdqe?
- 11 The LORD knóws our hümän thoughts; *
how like a puff / of wínd they äre.
- 12 Happy are they whom yóu instruct, 'Ö Lord! *
whom you teach out / of yóur läw;
- 13 To give them rést in évìl days, *
until a pit is dug for / the wíckëd.
- 14 For the LORD will not abándon his pëople, *
nor will he / forsáke his öwn.
- 15 For judgment wíll again bë just, *
and all the true of heart / will fóllow ít.
- 16 Who rose up for me agáinst the wícked? *
who took my part against the e/vildóërs?
- 17 If the LORD had not cóme to mÿ help, *
I should soon have dwelt in the land / of sílënce.
- 18 As often as I sáid, "My fóot häs slipped," *
your love, O LORD, / uphéld më.
- 19 When many cáres fill mÿ mind, *
your consolations / cheer mÿ söul.
