BLUEGRASS MASS?

Take one part Bluegrass music: a form of American roots music. Blend it together with the ancient liturgy of the Church – sometimes known as the Mass.... What do you get? A *Bluegrass Mass*, so to speak.

Though Bluegrass and Mass may culturally seem to be worlds apart, it's important to note that from its very roots, Bluegrass had a sacred, gospel side to it. Bluegrass itself was pioneered in a former Methodist Church (Union Gospel Tabernacle - later the original Grand Ol' Opry) – and Bluegrass pioneer Bill Monroe characterized the genre as: "Scottish bagpipes and ole-time fiddlin.' It's Methodist and Holiness and Baptist: It's blues and jazz, and it has a high lonesome sound."

Above all, Bluegrass music is music of deep longing and authenticity - it comes from the heart. Whether or not you think of yourself as a 'prayin' kinda person' - the songs, the themes and the overall spirit of Bluegrass calls us all into something deeper and primal and true. Heck, we Christians believe the same thing about the simple common act of sharing bread and wine.

The word 'Eucharist' literally means "Thanksgiving" and thus we gather in a spirit of gratitude for Jesus' giving of Himself. The word "Mass" comes from the Late-Latin word "Missa" (taken from the Latin mass) which means "Go; It is the dismissal" and thus we are sent out to continue our meal-sharing together.

And we allow this music and the ancient liturgy to draw us, like those wise folk of years ago, towards the light. We lift our hearts and our mind and our very selves towards the Star that illumines our path - even as we are mindful of the shadows and despair all around us. And so, in this strange season of Covid-19, while we are still unable to gather in the same ways, we bid you to bring your hearts longing and to sing it all out to God in song and prayer.



+The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ According to St. Matthew (2:1-12)

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

This is our song: Hosanna in the highest.


Jesus blessed you for the food; he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and said: This is my body, given for you all. Do this in remembrance of me.


