Land Acknowledgement

As we gather to worship, we acknowledge that for thousands of years the Coast Salish, Nuu-chah-nulth, and Kwakwaka'wakw peoples have walked gently on the unceded territories where we now live, work, worship, and play. Recognizing and lamenting the harm of colonialization, we seek ways to enter into new relationships based on gratitude, respect, truth-telling and justice.

We invite you to take a moment to remember and name with gratitude the people who have stewarded the lands on which you live - at AbbeyChurch this is the land of the Ləkɨvəŋən People, known today as the Esquimalt and Songhees Nations.

The Gospel

THE HOLY GOSPEL OF THE LORD JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO MARK

John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized vou with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. We give you thanks that your Spirit hovered over the waters of Creation, and by your word all things came to be.

Blessed be God for ever.

We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea, you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the promised land. **Blessed be God for ever.**

We give you thanks for sending your Son Jesus. For us he was baptized by John in the river Jordan. For us he was anointed as Christ by your Holy Spirit. For us he suffered the baptism of his own death and resurrection, setting us free from the bondage of sin and death, and opening to us the joy and freedom of everlasting life. **Blessed be God for ever.**

Now, in this time and place, we give you thanks for your Holy Spirit who comes to be with us, our Comfort and Peace, to teach us and lead us to all truth, to bear witness to the good news of the Gospel in our lives and in the life of the world.

Blessed be God for ever.

We give you thanks, for you have called us to new life through the waters of baptism. Now sanctify this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin.

Blessed be God for ever.

Today the grace of the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove dwelt upon the waters.

Today the Sun that never sets has dawned and the world is made radiant with the light of God.

Today all creation is watered by mystical streams.

Today we have been redeemed from the shadows and are filled with radiance by the light of the knowledge of God.

Today earth and sea share the joy of the world, and the world has been filled with gladness.

The Baptismal Covenant

Let us renew our baptismal covenant.

Do you believe in God?

I believe in God, The Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

I will, with God's help.

Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

I will, with God's help.

Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ? **I will, with God's help.**

Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself? I will, with God's help. Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

I will, with God's help.

Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth? I will, with God's help.

Let us pray, Blessed are you, God of all creation, to you be glory and praise for ever. You are our light and our salvation. From the deep waters of death you have raised your Son to life. Grant that all who have been born anew by water and the Spirit may daily be renewed in your image, walk by the light of faith and justice, and serve you in newness of life; through your anointed Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Bless all who long to be called beloved until all stand in your presence and are enfolded in your embrace. Through Christ, with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirt, all glory is yours, now and forever, **Amen.**

As beloved children of a loving parent, let us pray... (this may be said in a language or paraphrase of your choice, or as below):

Abba, Amma, Beloved, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.
