

Tuesday Morning Prayer - Epiphany 2022

Opening Prayer

The night has passed and the day lies open before us. Let us pray with one heart and mind.

Silence

As we rejoice in the gift of this new day, so may the light of your presence, O God, set our hearts on fire with love for you; now and forever. **Amen.**

Confession

Christ the light of the world has come to dispel the darkness. In his light, let us examine ourselves and confess our sins.

Silence

You were born for our salvation:
Lord, have mercy.

You came as Saviour to bring wholeness and peace:
Christ, have mercy.

You came to bring light into the darkness of our lives:
Lord, have mercy.

May the God of all healing and forgiveness draw us in and cleanse us from our sin, that we may behold the glory of the Son, Jesus Christ, the light of the world. **Amen.**

Invitatory

Christ has appeared to us,
O come, let us worship.

May God be merciful to us and bless us,

Show us the light of your countenance and come to us.

Let your ways be known upon earth,

Your saving health among all nations.

Let the peoples praise you, O God;
Let all the peoples praise you.

Let the nations be glad and sing for joy,
For you judge the peoples with equity and guide all the nations upon earth.

Let the peoples praise you, O God;
Let all the peoples praise you.

The earth has brought forth her increase;
May God, our own God, bless us.

May God bless us,
And may all the ends of the earth stand in awe.

Christ has appeared to us,
O come, let us worship.

First reading (optional)

After the reading: The word of the Lord.
Thanks be to God.

Psalm

Psalm (read or sung). At the conclusion:
Glory to you, Source of all Being, Eternal Word and Holy Spirit.

As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Gospel

An acclamation may be sung before.

Affirmation of Faith

Let us affirm our faith as we say,

**I believe in God,
The Father almighty,
Creator of heaven and earth.**

**I believe in Jesus Christ, his only
Son, our Lord.
He was conceived by the power of
the Holy Spirit

He suffered under Pontius Pilate,

On the third day he rose again.
He ascended into heaven,
And is seated at the right hand of
the Father,

To judge the living and the dead.**

And the life everlasting. Amen.**

Now and forever. Amen.**

Dismissal & Blessing

Christmastide (Jan 4):

May Christ, who by his incarnation
gathered into one things earthly and
heavenly, fill you with peace and
goodwill and make you partakers of
the divine nature. **Amen...**

Epiphany (Jan 6–Feb 27)

May God, who led the wise men by the
shining of a star to find the Christ,
lead you in your pilgrimage to find the
Lord. **Amen.**

May Christ, who turned water into
wine, transform your lives and make
glad your hearts. **Amen.**

May the Spirit, who came upon Jesus
at his baptism, pour out her gifts on
you who have come to the waters of
new birth. **Amen.**

...And the blessing of God, Source of all
Being, Eternal Word and Holy Spirit, be
among us and remain with us always.
Amen.

Let us bless the Lord.
Thanks be to God.
