# Confession:

You move us to delight in praising You; for You have made us for Yourself, And our hearts are restless until they rest in You. (St. Augustine) If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:8-9)
