

Bell. Silence. Bell.


Let us pray.

Self-examination and Confession

Let us now call to mind our sin and the infinite mercy of God.

Most merciful God, Holy and mighty Three-in-One and One-in-Three we confess that we have sinned in thought, word and deed.

We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength.

We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.

We have not forgiven others, as we have been forgiven.

Accept our repentance, O God.

for the wrongs we have done, for our inability to respond to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty.

Accept our repentance, O God.

For all false judgements, for uncharitable thoughts towards our neighbours and ourselves and for our prejudice and racism towards those who differ from us. **Accept our repentance**, **O God**.

For our waste and pollution of your creation and our lack of concern for those who come after us.

Accept our repentance, O God.

Restore and heal us for your mercy is great.

Accomplish in us the work of your salvation, that we may show your love in the world.

By the cross and passion of Jesus Christ, bring us with all your saints to the joy of Christ's resurrection.

Silence is kept.

In your mercy forgive where we have turned away, Make whole what needs mending, and direct what we shall be; that we may do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with you, our God. Amen.

We are here. You are here.




6) Bless The Lord
