We share a willingness to honestly wrestle with God–with our questions and doubts, our disillusionment with our institutions and our concern for our world.



As a witness to unity in diversity, the AbbeyChurch is an affirming (full inclusion and leadership of 2SLGBTQIA+ folk) shared ministry of The United Church of Canada and The Anglican Church of Canada.

We draw on those spiritual traditions, as well as others across the Christian spectrum. We're also connected to Emmaus, an intentional community that is inspired by monasticism and whose members make commitments to prayer, presence and simplicity.

We believe that Christ's love and grace binds our differences together and renews our hope as we gather each week at Jesus' table of radical welcome.

The AbbeyChurch acknowledges that we worship and pray on the stolen territory of the Ləkwəŋən peoples', the Songhees and Xwsepsum (Esquimalt) Nations. We strive to journey toward reparation, right relationship and reconciliation with justice. We confess the complicity of our religious traditions and institutions in the loss of life, lands, languages, spiritualities and cultures of the First Peoples' of these lands. We are grateful for the ongoing wisdom, stewardship and tending of these lands and apprentice ourselves to this good work of caring for creation and seeking to live in right-relationship with each other.



We Gather

Reader: When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here!... Christ is risen! **Christ is risen indeed, Alleluia!**

The paschal candle is lit. Ring your bells! Flowers are brought forward to decorate the empty cross during the next two songs.

Jesus Christ is risen today, hallelujah! our triumphant holy day, hallelujah! who did once, upon the cross, hallelujah! suffer to redeem our loss, hallelujah!

Hymns of praise then let us sing, hallelujah! unto Christ, our heavenly King, hallelujah! who endured the cross and grave, hallelujah! sinners to redeem and save, hallelujah!

But the pains which he endured, hallelujah! our salvation have procured, hallelujah! now above the sky he's King, hallelujah! where the angels ever sing, hallelujah!

The Gospel

Let us proclaim the gospel from the rooftops. With our words and with our lives! A reading from the Gospel according to Luke.

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but they said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to the hands of sinners and be crucified and on the third day rise again." Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, wondering to himself what had happened. (Luke 24: 1-12, NRSVUE and NIV)

Joy and gladness are our song, redeeming God, for Christ is risen and the tomb is empty! And as we rejoice in the paschal mystery, we remember Jesus, who gathered with his disciples and took bread, gave thanks, blessed and broke it and gave it to disciples saying take and eat, this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.

And after supper he took the cup. He gave thanks and gave it to his companions, saying, "Drink this all of you; this is my blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you and many for the Forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it in remembrance of me."

And so we proclaim the great mystery of faith: Christ has died! Christ is risen! Christ will come again!

Joy and gladness are our song, merciful God, for in a garden of life, you have rolled away the stone of fear and despair, the stone of oppression, the stone of sin, the stone of lament, the stone of death.

As you did in creation so too in the wonder of your resurrection - send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts of bread and wine that they may be to us the body and blood of the risen Christ. Come among us once more and breathe into us your peace, breathe into us your life, that all who labour, all who weep, all who hunger, all who rejoice, may meet you here - in the breaking of the bread.

Shape your church to be your risen body, a diverse and beautiful demonstration of our Kingdom until you come again and we are made one in your love. **Amen.**

The Prayer of Jesus

As beloved children of a loving parent, we pray as Jesus taught: Our *Father (*or Parent, or Abba, or Amma, or Source, or Mother) who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. 
