



A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When they had brought the apostles, they had them stand before the council. The Gospel

Let us proclaim the gospel from the rooftops. **With our words and with our lives!** A reading from the Gospel according to John.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors were locked where the disciples were, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later, his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written so that

you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

Let us proclaim the Gospel from the rooftops.

You are holy, O God of majesty, and blessed is Jesus Christ our Lord. With thanksgiving, we remember his words: I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you.

And so this afternoon, we remember how he took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me. And after supper, he took the cup saying, This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, remember me

Remembering your acts of mercy, we celebrate this feast of the risen Lord, offering our lives in thanksgiving and praise as we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died! Christ is risen! Christ will come again!

As you did in creation, so too in the wonder of your resurrection - send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts of bread and wine that they may be to us the body and blood of the risen Christ. Fridays at 8:15 am - morning prayer - on-line zoom only


