


We Gather

The Gospel

Let us proclaim the Gospel from the rooftops. **With our words and with our lives!** A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew (24:36-44)

But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.





When we fled from you / you sought us out and gathered us like a *mother sheep / covered us in your mercy / and set us a place at your table.




Glory to you fore - ver and ever.

QOMQEM is Back!!

Join AbbeyChurch in Supporting weekly Indigenous-Led Night Outreach

QomQem Coastal Connections has operated a weekly night outreach initiative for the past two years, bringing basic needs, hot and cold foods, harm reduction, and other supplies to the street family. This Indigenous-and-lived-experience-led outreach model follows Coast Salish teachings that everyone should have a home, food to eat, and a role in the community.

Last year, Qom Qem partnered with AbbeyChurch, North Park Neighborhood Association, Neighborhood Solidarity for the Unhoused, and family members connected to the street community. Together, we collected donations, prepared comforting foods, and delivered supplies to 150 individuals each Sunday night.

Items Needed: Drop them off into the treasure chest at the back!

- Non perishable foods used in the weekly menu: Gatorade/Powerade, juice boxes, fruit cups, pudding cups, peanut butter and jam (large jars), noodle bowls, large bags of candy/baked treats
- <u>Supplies:</u> Gloves, hats, socks, hand warmers, high-quality umbrellas, raincoats, winter coats, tarps, winter weight sleeping bags, emergency blankets, batteries, flashlights, tents
- <u>Inexpensive phones</u> and pay as you go phone credits

Volunteer: starting today, QomQem will be in the kitchen each Sunday after worship (about 5:15pm) - and AbbeyChurch folk are welcome to come and volunteer.
